These are the violations we have on record.

FCC Violations

August 14, 1997

1. Section 11.15- At the time of inspection, the Emergency Alert System (EAS) handbook was not posted.
2. Section 11.17(a) At the time of inspection, the EAS authenticator list was not available.
3. Section 11.35(a)- The new EAS encoder/decoder was installed, however, the person present at the time of inspection was not familiar with the EAS equipment. The station chief engineer could not get the EAS equipment to work. All duty personnel must be familiar with operation of the EAS equipment. It was not possible to determine if the EAS equipment was functioning as required.
4. Section 11.52(a)- The station is not logging received EAS tests. Station personnel indicated that the printed strips generated by the EAS equipment were routinely being thrown out.
5. Section 11.61(a)- The station is not conducting transmitted EAS tests on a weekly and monthly basis. At the time of inspection, the station chief engineer indicated that he thought the station was "exempt" since it is a college educational station. The only stations classified as "exempt" are those who operate at a power of 10 watts. These stations are not exempt from having the EAS equipment installed, however, they do not have to have equipment capable of transmitting the EAS tests. Stations may obtain authorization to become "Non-Participating National (NN Category)". A "Non-Participating National (NN Category)" is not exempt from having the equipment installed and conducting transmitted/received tests. This type of station would not remain on the air during a national EAS activation.
6. Section 73.3526(a)- At the time of inspection, the public file was incomplete and filled with unnecessary information.
7. Section 73.1230(a)- At the time of inspection, the most recent license was not available. The authorized level could not be determined.

This is the information from the letter we sent to the FCC on August 27, 1997.

We addressed the issues as follows:

1. Section 11.15- The EAS handbook was obtained from the FCC website and posed in the station's control room. A hard copy of this handbook has also been requested from the FCC and will be placed in the control room when it is received.
2. Section 11.17(a)- At the time of inspection, the EAS authenticator list was not available. We have since requested this list from the Emergency Communications Division, and will post this list in the station's control room when once received.
3. Section 11.35(a)- EAS encoder/decoder installation and equipment familiarity. Since your inspection the EPROM has been replaced on the EAS system and the system is operating as required. Station personnel are being trained to be familiar with all aspects of the EAS system.
4. Section 11.52(a) The station not logging the EAS tests. The printed strips generated by the EAS system are now being attached to the transmitter logs. All station personnel will be trained to follow this procedure.
5. Section 11.61(a) The station is not conducting transmitted EAS tests on a weekly and monthly basis. The station personnel has reviewed the information on EAS testing and will conduct these tests on a weekly and monthly basis as required by the FCC.

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
