Dear Ms Dortch:

Minnesota Public Radio ("MPR") became the licensee of translator K247BF in Decorah, IA, in August 2008. Because this facility was causing interference with another station, MPR filed an electronic Request for Silent STA on December 15, 2008 (file no. BLSTA-20081215ACN). MPR subsequently filed a minor change application to move the translator to another frequency in order to resolve the interference issue (file no. BPFT-20090121AID).


The construction permit for this change was granted on January 23, 2009. The facility's call sign was changed to K244EM at that time. A license application on Form 350 was filed prior to commencing program testing on January 29, as specified in special operating condition 2 of the construction permit, and the station resumed operation on January 30.

This notification is being made in accordance with special operating condition 3 of the construction permit.

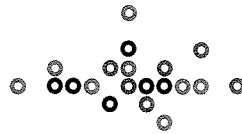
An Anti-Drug Abuse Act certification form is attached. MPR is a noncommercial educational licensee; therefore, no fee is required for this filing.
